Slips trips and falls	Broken bones, bruising, concussion	Field participants	2	2	low	Wear sturdy footwear. Be aware of and take extra care on uneven ground, steep ground, wet grass
Obstacles	Cuts, sprains, bruising	Field participants	2	2	low	Take extra care and avoid if possible, obstacles such as fencing, barbed wire, debris
Falling Rocks		Field participants	3	5	low	Stay behind fencing. Wear a hard hat if going close to cliff face, do not hammer at a cliff face
Insect bites, stings, nettle rash	Skin irritation	Field participants	2	2	low	Wear long sleeves and trousers. Carry insect repellent if required.
Weather	Hypothermia / Sunstroke	Field participants	2	2	low	Check the weather forecast and wear appropriate clothing.
Vehicles in car park	Minor or major injury or death from person – vehicle collision.	Field participants	1	3	low	Stay alert when parking and walking to and from cars

1. Participants are expected to be in sufficiently good health to spend 1/1/2 hours of gentle walking. Those with underlying health conditions should make themselves known to the trip leader and carry on themselves a list of prescriptive medicines being taken. This information may be essential to emergency service personnel.
2. Under 16s must be accompanied by a responsible adult.

Calculating Risk:

Risk rating is calculated by multiplying the likelihood of anything happening by the consequences if it does.

Likelihood x Severity

Likelihood		Severity of consequences	
5	Almost Certain	5	Fatality
4	Probable	4	Major injury/illness resulting in disability
3	Possible	3	Injury/ illness, requires doctors/ hospital treatment
2	Possible (under unfortunate circumstances)	2	Minor injury, requires first aid
1	Rare	1	Minor Injury, no first aid.

High risk 16- 25

Do not proceed with activity in current form.

Medium risk 9-15

Only have this level for short-term exposure. Ensure that steps are being taken to reduce the risk, e.g. use of additional safety equipment or a change of route.

Low Risk 1-8

Acceptable activity but should be monitored and regularly reviewed to check for suitability.

If at any point any part of the survey does not feel safe, the leader will stop the tour.
